GO to St. JOSEPH

The Office for Lay Collaboration in Ministry (OLCM) was delighted to present an online session for 20 participants from our parish, on 12 Aug 2021. The session **'GO TO ST. JOSEPH'** was based on Pope Francis' Apostolic Exhortation 'Patris Corde' – "With a Father's heart". It helped to understand and appreciate the life of St Joseph and how one could reflect on various attitudes and qualities of St Joseph and incorporate these values in our daily life.

WHY ST. JOSEPH: After Mary, the Mother of God, no saint is mentioned more frequently in the Papal Magisterium than Joseph, her spouse.

Blessed Pius IX declared him **'Patron of the Universal Catholic Church'**,

Venerable Pius XII proposed him as 'Patron of Workers' and

Saint John Paul II as **'Guardian of the Redeemer'**.

Saint Joseph is universally invoked as the **"Patron of a happy death"**.

Now 150 years after his proclamation as Patron of the Universal Catholic Church by Blessed Pius IX on 8 December 1870, Pope Francis has shared some personal reflections on this extraordinary figure, St Joseph, who is so close to our own human experience.

In his Apostolic Letter titled, **PATRIS CORDE**, which means, **'With a Father's Heart'** Pope Francis felt the need even more during this pandemic. We used these reflections as a basis for this session.

A ROLE MODEL FOR LAITY: St. Joseph comes across as an apt MODEL in the way we live our lives in the family, in the society and in the Church and so we looked at St Joseph in his role as a father and saw what we can learn from him as; a Beloved Father, Tender Loving Father, Obedient Father, Accepting Father and Creatively Courageous Father.

Thereafter, we looked at St. Joseph as a **ROLE MODEL OF FAITH HOPE AND LOVE** through the qualities of, **Acting without expectation, Sanctity of work, Model of discernment and faith, Protector of the family, Availability and resourcefulness.** Finally concluded the session with **St. Joseph the Sleeping Saint.**

Pope Francis, who had a statue of a sleeping St. Joseph on his desk for decades, brought the statue he had in Argentina with him to the Vatican when he was elected Pope.

"Even when he is asleep, he is taking care of the Church! Yes! We know that he can do that. So when I have a problem, a difficulty, I write a little note and I put it underneath St. Joseph, so that he can dream about it! In other words, I tell him: Pray for this problem!" said Pope Francis. **"Do not forget St. Joseph who sleeps! Jesus slept with the protection of Joseph."**

The session ended with a PRAYER and a vote of thanks. On behalf of the participants, Bro Theo D'sa thanked OLCM for hosting this interesting session for the parishioners of OLVC Nerul.



World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly

Pope Francis emphatically urges and reminds young people, adults and our society to join hands and save the elderly.

Grandparents and grandchildren share a very strong and loving bond, a unique and meaningful connection. Spending time with grandchildren is a wonderful reminder of the pleasures of life, especially when they are blessed with nicknames..... nan, pop, granny, grandpa, papu, nanu and even "toughy". Vianney Sunday Celebration

In August we celebrated Vianney Sunday, the feast of St. John Marie Vianney, the patron of Parish Priests (also extended to all priests). On this day, we show our gratitude towards our priests and thank God for them. In our own parish we have a parishioner who has been recently ordained to the priesthood and another a seminarian. However, not always do we hear about this attitude of gratitude towards our priests. Unfortunately, we also hear about many things about them that make us wonder in disbelief and sometimes disgust. Hence, I decided to share my own reflections about this Office (not the people holding the office).

Those who know me personally, knew that I had this inclination of joining the Priesthood, but over the years, life happened, and I decided to not pursue this inclination. The decision to not join the Priesthood was from a scene of a movie I have seen a countless times, but never really pondered on - the scene of the Burning Bush. If Christ is the same God who appeared to Moses in the fire of that bush which illuminated it but did not consume it, then when I touch the Host which after consecration becomes the Body and Blood of the same Christ Jesus, who am I and what am I to even

consider this office, where among other things I get to touch "this" God. This isn't some pious reflection as seen in Psalm 8:4. I was in fear of death recalling at the same time what happened to the "poor soul" Uzzah who tried to simply steady the Ark of God's presence, and he was struck down by the Lord. When a priest touches the Sacred Host, this is who he touches. I started looking at the Office of Priesthood as the Tent of Meeting or the Holy of Holies in the Temple where only the High Priest was allowed to enter. Many will say, that when God is with you, why worry or bother. But do we really understand who this God is? Can we afford to take him so casually? It wasn't His anger that dissuaded me but His sheer splendor and majesty that made me choose to stand outside the Tent and rather educate the people around, His reality, lest we be spewed out of His mouth for our lukewarm attitude (Rev. 3:15). Our priests are frail and weak just as we are. Of the many burdens they carry, they carry the burden of having to face God, the same One, who spoke with Moses Face-to-Face. I wonder, how many of us would want to be in that place? I was feared out of my wits. These men were not. It is not a place of power. It is a place of great trial. Hence, let us not only pray for them from a distance but help them by our words of affection.



Legion of Mary - Centenary 2021

OLVC Praesidia Legion of Mary

On 7th Sept 1921 The Legion of Mary, began in a poor and old part of Dublin. A property know as Myra House in Francis Street. Amongst the lay people the guiding spirit was Mr. Frank Duff, who has rightly been recognised as founder of the Legion of Mary.

In great measure the remarkable success which has attended the Legion of Mary in so many parts of the world, under the widest variety of circumstances and in so many diverse works, has sprung, under the generous hands of Mary, from the excellence of its organisation. Its system not only enkindles the spirit of apostolic zeal in its members, but directs it to most effective service. The Legion draws its inspiration from St. Louis Marie de Montfort's book True Devotion to Mary.

While insisting on the spirit of humility and obedience in all its members, it encourages the initiative of the individual in its system of reports and discussion. Through the control exercised over the activities of all its members by the weekly Presidium meeting and the supervision of individual Praesidia by the higher councils, it gives every opportunity for a campaign of planned action.

Membership of the Legion of Mary is open to all Catholics who lead edifying lives and who are prepared to fulfil each and every duty which Legion membership involves. Persons wishing to join the Legion must apply for membership to a Praesidium. No candidate

can be accepted without the sanction of the spiritual director. Active Membership requires the following: 1. The punctual and regular attendance at the weekly meeting of the Praesidium, and the furnishing there of an adequate report on the work done. 2. The daily recitation of the Catena. 3 The performance of a substantial active Legionary work, in the spirit of faith and in union with Mary. 4. The observance of an absolute secrecy in regard to any matter discussed at the meeting or learnt in connection with Legionary work. Auxiliary members are basically praying members, they commit to praying a daily rosary and the Tessera. Their daily prayers put the army behind the active members who go out into the community. Without their prayers, we would not be successful in our works.

Our parish OLVC legion of Mary was founded on 14th July 2013. Legionaries have visited Orphanages, Hospitals, Old age homes, Eucharistic communion to the sick and Home bound, Mass for sick and home bound, rendered service when requested and house to house visits.

The Legion of Mary is really a system that is ahead of its time, one hundred years ago, and it is possibly more necessary today than ever, especially during this pandemic.

On 27 March 2014, the Secretary of the Pontifical Council for the Laity, Bishop Josef Clemens, delivered the decree in which the Legion is recognised by the Holy See as International Association of the Faithful.

It is time of joy, celebration and of thanksgiving.

Mary Our Mother, Pray for Us

"God said: 'Let us make man in Our image, after Our likeness,'" (Gen 1:26) after which He created Adam and Eve and all of humanity. Sadly, this divine image, as we know, was defaced in man when humanity committed original sin by disobeying God at the beginning of human history. We recognize this story as the Fall of humanity. Yes, it seems that we had it all in the beginning, but lost it all because of original sin.

Given Christ Jesus' intimate relationship with Mary as her Son, the Church has reflected since the early centuries on Mary's holiness. A crucial question arising from this reflection was whether God would permit the woman that was destined to be the mother of the Holy One to be subjected to the universality of original sin as all people are. Mary was uniquely privileged with the preservation from all stain of original sin from the first moment of her conception.

But, how was the Immaculate Conception possible and why was the Immaculate Conception necessary? God had created Adam and Eve sinless: from the very first moment of conception. Similarly, the Almighty God—Who wanted to do something new for humanity—manifested His power, wisdom,

and goodness in bestowing upon Mary total sinlessness from conception as He granted to the First Eve. He chose to do so given that Mary is an integral part of God's new creation of humanity through Christ. This "singular grace and privilege" was given to Mary by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ her Son. The New Adam essentially redeemed Mary from the initial moment of her conception and made her the New Eve in this new work of creation.

In addition, the Blessed Mother of our Lord was not only free of original sin, but, being full of grace, was also free of all actual, or personal, sin in her life for the glory of her beloved Son. The New Eve was impeccable, unlike the First.



Since sin separates us from God, it was right and just for Jesus Christ to be conceived in a pure and sinless temple.

When God stated, "I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers," (Gen 3:15) . Her offspring, Jesus Christ, would need her perpetual "yes" to God for His glory. Indeed, "out of honor to the Lord," Mary was preserved from all stain of original sin, and remained sinless throughout her life. Therefore, the Immaculate Conception is the Holy Temple.

It also challenges us to continually cooperate with God's grace, which calls us all to holiness. May the Blessed Mother's intercession assist us in attaining holiness and salvation.
